

SITUATION REPORT #3

Earthquake and Tsunami Wave
Sipora Island, N. Pagai Island, S.Pagai Island – Mentawai Islands District
West Sumatra



General Situation

It has been a week since the Tsunami wave swept Mentawai Islands. Aid has come from government and various organizations, but distribution become the main constraint. Waves as high as 5 meters pounded coastal areas on Sunday, leaving more than 14.000 IDPs stranded in 26 villages. Air transport also face challenges, extreme weather cause risky flights. Thus, logistic aids were pooled only in Sikakap and Padang, which cause logistic distribution become very expensive.

IBU Foundation team has visited the most remote villages in South Pagai on Friday. The IDPs said that even logistic aids, such as food have been dropped from air, the IDPs still have difficulties accessing it as the drop point were faraway from their villages.

Need Assessment



Water and Sanitation: Water access is become a serious problem. People use rainwater and/or river as drinking water. The continue practice could lead to serious medical problem such as diarrhea which ca lead to death, especially to children. The needs are to provide potable water and hygiene kits.

Food Aid: Existing food supplies are nearly gone. People is depending on coconut to survive now, initially they eat rice then banana. Food aids dropped from air (mostly biscuits) are not nearly enough to the survivors. Many aid materials were damaged because it were dropped to the sea and rivers. The needs are food supply that could be easily consumed without further

processing as cooking utensils and fuel is not available.



Shelters and Non food items: Few tarpaulins are visible. Communities set up their camps in pineapple fields, using bamboo, leaves and other available material for making shelter. The needs for shelter is to provide tents/tarpaulins, cloths, family kits, blankets, mosquito nets.



Medical Service: Many people are starting to have diarrhea, especially children. Several people who wounded are getting infection. People are developing psychosocial symptoms, and it getting worse due to frequent earthquake (up to 50 times/daily). Medical and psychosocial services are very much needed for providing services to the IDPs. Many people are getting high risk to get malaria, as malaria is endemic in Mentawai.

Logistic is the major constraint in responding the emergency situation. Logistic distribution cost becomes very expensive. Boat rental could be as high as US \$1000 per day, while speedboat could cost US \$400 per trip, and chopper rental cost US \$3000 per hour.
